Recording work on seesaw

There are 2 ways your child can complete their work.

1. By writing in a workbook provided and uploading a photograph to seesaw.
2. By entering content directly into seesaw.

We encourage children to write in workbooks where possible as this will support their writing stamina and handwriting during this period of school closure.

Where possible, we have asked teachers to ensure pupils are not required to select answers on a worksheet, however, this is not always easy. If children are for example, required to 'circle an answer', then this can be recorded in a workbook by writing the date, the question number and the answer only. We do not expect children to copy down the full question- we wouldn't do this at school.

If your child is struggling to record, for any reason, please get in touch with their class teacher who will be very understanding and will offer solutions based on individual need.

Timetables

We have asked teachers to begin lessons as the timetable sets out. As lessons are now recorded and uploaded to seesaw, or accessible in Teams, there is no need to delay their start time.

If pupils are late they will be able to catch up on what they have missed via the recording. Teachers are always happy to help with this.

Length of sessions

It has been mentioned to us that lunchtime is rather long and school is finishing earlier than usual. Some parents are also concerned that there is not enough time to complete set tasks after live lessons.

The lunch period enables pupils in school to eat their lunch safely and to access physical activity. If this is something which cannot take place at home, then please feel free to use this time to complete tasks.

Children need a break from online learning as we are finding that many pupils in school are becoming more tired than usual.

3-3.30pm should be used to complete tasks as it is in school if required.
